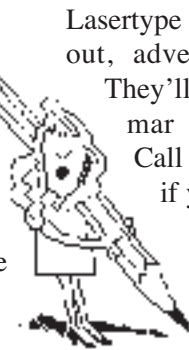

This omission needs to be rectified by filing the proper paperwork for encroachment and obtaining the required insurance.

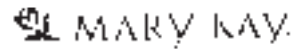

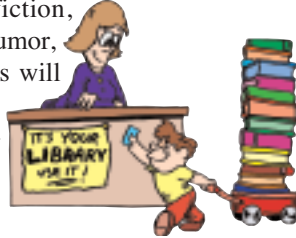

It's Cool to be Safe from the Sun

South Suburban Parks and Recreation is not only concerned about water safety when you visit the outdoor pools this summer but also about sun safety. South Suburban is participating in a program called *Pool Cool* that was developed by Nation Recreation Park Association, the Rollins School of Public Health, and Emory University that encourages positive sun safety practices among children, their families, and swimming pool employees throughout the United States. The program aims to advance children's sun safety habits and sunscreen use, while also improving sun protection awareness at outdoor swimming pools.

Skin cancer is the fastest growing form of cancer in the United States; there are over one million new cases diagnosed every year. It is well known that sun protection can prevent about 90% of all skin cancer cases, and youth are at the highest risk for overexposure because of the large amount of time they spend outside. Overexposure to the sun's rays, before turning 18, tends to cause higher rates of skin cancer later in life. Practical sun protection incorporates four elements including covering up, seeking shade, using sunscreen properly and avoiding overexposure during peak hours of 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.

South Suburban is implementing the *Pool Cool* program into both swimming lessons and public swim times using teaching materials, games, signs and posters. As part of South Suburban's participation, researchers will be contacting instructors at summers end to inquire about the incorporation of *Pool Cool* into swimming lessons, what worked and what didn't integrating results into continuing research.

So get out, get wet and stay safe from the sun at a South Suburban outdoor pool. For outdoor pool locations, public swim hours and swimming lesson information visit www.ssspr.org.

New Construction Project—Local Agency Project Begins Next Week at Arapahoe Road Just East of I-25

Arapahoe County – On Monday, July 10th, the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) and the city of Greenwood Village will begin an intersection improvement project at Arapahoe Road and Boston Street/Clinton Street just east of I-25. The project realigns Boston Street and Clinton Street and adds a dedicated right turn lane on northbound and southbound Boston Street/Clinton Street onto Arapahoe Road. The project will be constructed in three phases to reduce traffic impacts on Arapahoe Road, Boston Street and Clinton Street. Each phase is expected to take approximately 90 days to complete. The first phase will construct the east side of Boston Street/Clinton Street, the second phase will construct the west side of the intersection and the third phase will construct the center medians.

Motorists can expect various single lane closures throughout the project on Boston Street, Clinton Street and Arapahoe Road. Lane closures will be dependent on the phase of construction and

will take place Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Minor delays are expected at the intersection. Access to businesses will remain open during the project. KECI is the contractor of this \$2.1 million project, which will be complete by the end of April 2007.

The Accidental Potato Chip



The potato chip is the fortuitous result of a restaurant complaint. In 1853 at Moon's Lake House, a high-fashion resort in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., a patron complained that chef George Crum's fried potatoes were too thick. According to the National Snack Association, Crum was miffed - and decided to fry up a batch of potatoes so thin and crisp that they couldn't be skewered by a fork. His get-even plan backfired: the unhappy patron and other restaurant guests loved his innovation, and Crum's "Saratoga Chips," as they were first called, immediately became a popular restaurant item. By 1895, entrepreneurs began making potato chips for sale in stores, but potato chips really took off with the invention of a mechanical potato peeler in the 1920s. According to the Snack Food Association, potato chips are currently a \$6 billion retail market, making them America's number one savory snack. Annual consumption of potato chips and shoestring potatoes in the U.S. amounts to 17 pounds per person.

Better Backpacks

The organization Safe Kids USA points out that pedestrian injury remains the second leading cause of unintentional death among children 5 to 14. One way to reduce that risk is by adding a strip of reflective tape to children's backpacks. The Insurance Corp. of British Columbia notes that a car traveling at 60 miles per hour needs 260 feet to stop. That same car's headlights can pick up a small reflective tag as far as 500 feet away. Reflective tape is available at hardware stores, bike shops, and sports and outdoor suppliers.
